
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Background

- The need for NFSA to incrementally deploy its food control activities to support the compliance capacity of the various production sectors.






Values



1.1 Develop tailored guidance to Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) on current regulatory measures for enhanced food safety practices to Prerequisite programs and Preventive controls	 April – July 2023 Consultation with the Sector Minimum Requirements of Food Safety Performance, in the form of voluntary guidance related to Prerequisite Programs (PRPs) and Preventive Controls 	
1.2 Adapt the Food Regulatory Regime to the Operational Requirements of Egyptian Food Business Operators (FBOs) with a special focus on SMEs	 April 2023 – April 2024 Proposed changes to the current regulatory provisions for PRPs and Preventive Controls Amended Regulatory Provisions for PRPs and Preventive Controls based on the review conducted Revised Inspection requirements, adapted to the size of establishments and in line with the amended regulatory provisions

Strategic Goal 2: Modernize Egypt's Food Safety Legislation and Operationalize Relevant Supporting Regulatory Frameworks

2.1 Operationalize the risk-based approach for food import control	 April – December 2023 Updated procedures and protocols associated with risk-based import control. Digitalized tools / applications supporting the implementation of the developed procedures deployed within NFSA.
2.2 Operationalize domestic food control on a risk-basis, and initiate a food regulatory review through collaborative approaches with actors of the production sector	 April – July 2023 Approved risk matrix for characterizing food production establishments to support risk-based inspection of domestic Food Business Operators (FBOs). April – August 2023 Proposed framework for food regulatory review targeting previously issued regulations by NFSA, including prioritized regulations requiring amendments. June 2023 – April 2024 Two (2) priority regulations, previously promulgated by NFSA, amended to reflect input from the stakeholder community and scientific information. May – December 2023 Established Protocol for the development and promulgation of food regulatory provisions adopted by NFSA, including the requirements to

rely upon scientific and risk assessments.

3.1 Enable effective participation of Egyptian delegations in activities, events of the Codex Alimentarius Commission, and in its technical committees relevant to NFSA's mandate	 April – December 2023 Procedure covering approaches of collaboration between EOS and NFSA on codex matters developed and endorsed. Codex positions developed by NFSA for key /priority committees.
3.2 Play a leading role in the development of cooperation and partnership frameworks at the regional level with the creation of collaborative forums amongst and between Arab and African food regulators and with international food regulatory authorities	 April 2023 – April 2024 Proposed African Food Authorities Forum organized in Cairo with NFSA's leadership. NFSA leading food regulatory collaboration activities in line with NFSA's regulatory priorities at the African and Arab level. An international engagement strategy for NFSA's leadership developed and implemented with prioritized areas of collaboration with international food regulators.

4.1 Enhance Food Laboratory Operations with the Operationalization of NFSA's Food Reference Laboratories	 April 2023 – April 2024 Program for food laboratory training developed and implemented. An official compendium of food regulatory methods is established by NFSA. NFSA's laboratories play the role of reference laboratories in the Egyptian food laboratory landscape. 	
4.2 Develop a Food Safety Science Capacity to Anchor NFSA's Decision-Making in Food Risk Analysis	 April 2023 – April 2024 A Cohort of food risk assessors, amongst NFSA's staff is regularly trained on food risk assessment techniques. April – August 2023 A data base of food occurrence data is created and populated for use by NFSA food risk assessors.
